**RE: APPLICATION FOR SUSPENSION OF THE NO<sub>x</sub> NEW PLANT MINIMUM EMISSIONS STANDARDS AND ATMOSPHERIC EMISSION LICENCE (AEL) VARIATION REQUEST FOR THE ACACIA POWER STATION IN CAPE TOWN, WESTERN CAPE PROVINCE**

**Notice of Decision (DFFE Reference: WC/ES-AC/COCT/20200901)**

Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd submitted an application for suspension of the NO<sub>x</sub> new plant Minimum Emissions Standards and Atmospheric Emission Licence (AEL) Variation Request for the Acacia Power Station in Cape Town, Western Cape Province.

**DECISION**

Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd hereby notifies all registered interested and affected parties in terms of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations (Government Notice (GN) No. R. 982 of 4 December 2014) (as amended), promulgated in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA) (Act No. 107 of 1998), and the requirements of the National Environmental Management: Air Quality Act (NEM:AQA) (Act No. 39 of 2004), as amended, that the application has been processed and the National Air Quality Officer (NAQO) has, with concurrence of the Atmospheric Emission Licencing Authority, made a decision dated 30 October 2021, as follows:

\* All minimum emission standards are expressed on a daily average basis, under normal conditions of 273 Kelvin, 15% oxygen and 101.3 kPa.

#### **AEL Variation Request:**

This decision will have to be reflected in Eskom's Atmospheric Emission License (AEL) to be of force and effect. Therefore, Eskom will liaise with the relevant AEL Authority in this regard as soon as possible so that the required amendments, variations, and additions to the AEL can be affected.

#### **Further details of the decision are outlined below:**

- Eskom is required to submit a quarterly progress report on the implementation of the compliance road map and commitments made in support of the suspension application for Eskom Acacia Power Station. The reports must be submitted to the National Air Quality Officer and the Licensing Authority following the department's financial year.
- Furthermore, the AEL will not be renewed beyond the suspension date as stipulated in the table above.
- The decommissioning plan for Eskom Acacia Power Station must be submitted to the Department a year from the date of issue of this decision.

#### **RIGHT TO APPEAL**

As interested and affected parties, your attention is drawn to the appeal procedure in Chapter 2 of the NEMA National Appeal Regulations (NAR), 2014 (published under Government Notice (GN) R993 in Government Gazette No. 38303 dated 08 December 2014). A copy of the appeal Regulations is included with this notification letter.

Should any person wish to lodge an appeal against this decision, he/she must submit the appeal in writing to the appeal administrator (**Table 1**) and a copy of the appeal to the applicant, any registered IAP, and any organ of state with interest in the matter within 20 days from 6 January 2022.

The appeal period will, therefore, run from 6 January 2022 until 25 January 2022.
